

We also run a crèche for the very young to allow parents to attend worship. After the service we meet for coffee/tea in the church hall to continue fellowship together.

The Guild

The guild meets once a month on a Tuesday. The aim of the movement is "to invite and encourage both woman and men to commit their lives to Jesus Christ and to enable them to express their faith in worship, prayer, and action". The associated motto is "Whose I am, and Whom I serve".
